

An example of a simple legacy in your Will:

I give free of inheritance tax [the entirety/percentage of my residuary estate OR fixed amount] to The Courtauld Institute of Art, Somerset House, Strand, London, WC2R ORN, company registration number 4464432 and an exempt charity under the Charities Act 2011, HMRC charity tax reference XR60596 for its general charitable purposes absolutely and I declare that the receipt of the Treasurer, Head of Finance or other appropriate officer for the time being shall be a good discharge to my Executors.
